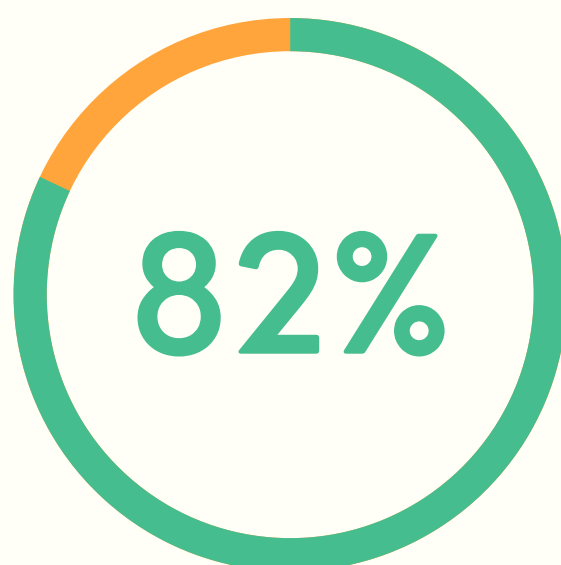


FAHS MFP MASTERS PROGRAM FELLOWS
